Subarachnoid Haemorrhage in a Patient with Complaints of Recurrent Headaches and Neck Pain since Two Months Ago: A Case Report

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AABSTRACT

Background: Headache is one of the most important complaints in patients referred to the emergency department.

Subarachnoid haemorrhage (SAH) is a major differential diagnosis in these patients, which usually occurs as a severe and

sudden headache that the patient has not experienced so far. In this case the patient complaint of recurrent headache

within 2 month that is a rare manifestation of SAH.

Conclusion: The SAH is one of the most critical differential diagnoses in headache and always must be consider in patients

with no specific diagnosis. In suspected patients brain CT scan and LP should be done to confirm SAH.
